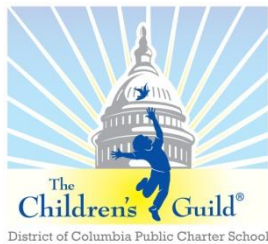

Call to Order

On behalf of Ms. Greene, Mr. Kros called the meeting to order at 6:15pm.

Public Comments

There were no public comments.

Minutes

A motion to approve the minutes from the May 12, 2017 meeting was made by Mr. Ferguson and seconded by Ms. Samuels. The motion was approved.

Principal's Report

Ms. Nicholson gave a year-end report highlighting the work of the students by grade including blending sounds, mathematics and learning about the stock market, writing poems using metaphors, social studies, and measurements. Ms. Nicholson asked for board assistance for the next school year in the form of hygiene kits (*toothpaste, soap, deodorant, wash clothes, gender specific products*), and sponsorship for an upcoming skating trip to assist with the cost of buses. She explained that to fund the entire trip costs \$480. Mr. Daniels mentioned the prospect of partnering with the neighboring church or taking on the endeavor as a school, to start a food pantry to help serve the needs to the parent community. Ms. Nicholson said that there is a definite need for a freezer in the school to store meats and other perishables to give to parents. She reported that 100 students will participate in Extended School Year (ESY) this summer.

Mr. Daniels shared some of the engaging activities that happened this school year including parent breakfasts, the She Tea and Guys in Ties events in May, field trips to downtown Baltimore facilitated by Ms. Smith, a highly successful excursion to Six Flags America, and a field day collaboration with another school in the District of Columbia. The events exemplified the work and influence of The Children's Guild in that students exhibited positive behaviors during their social interactions. Mr. Daniel's also shared video and picture highlights from the prom activities. The group discussed pending teaching institutes for staff over the summer to help prepare for the upcoming school year. He mentioned at least half of the staff will be in the

building in July so there is ample time for professional development. Mr. Daniels' informed that the full staff returns on August 7, 2017. (See attached Principal's Report).

Student Recruitment Report

Ms. Giles reported that 167 families have re-enrolled of the 280 current applications. 334 provided intent to return letters were sent out at the beginning of the enrollment process and that outcome yielded the 280 letters. She also reported 73 new families, with 9 registering on myschooldc over the past weekend. Ms. Giles mentioned that her next step is to take scanners and laptops and travel to family's homes to assist with re-enrollment. She mentioned that she and Ms. Wise are calling parents to follow up on recommitments and going out in to the community on Wednesdays to circulate flyers. She also mentioned that recruitment-oriented events are being planned for the ESY session. Ms. Nicholson will share a one-pager with information on the school for Board to use as a talking point for student enrollment. The group also discussed elevating signage around the school to make the location more visible from various angles in the community. Mr. Kros offered to investigate the possibilities of PSA placement and elevated signage for the school.

PTO Report

Ms. Giles reported on the last PTO meeting this month which was attended by 6-7 parents. She explained that they went over the parent organization policy and offered caregivers an opportunity to express concerns. She mentioned that the next meeting is in July and will be a parent workshop centered on using technology including computers and school-related web-based applications.

School Outcome Data and Grants Update (See attached data spreadsheet)

Dr. Arbogast reported that attendance has been at an extreme high and suspensions have been low this month. He also reported that the amount of parent complaints has also remained low during this month. Dr. Arbogast alerted that the Mayor recommended a 1.5 % increase in uniform funding, however, the final outcome was a 3% increase.

Other Items

The board discussed the possibly cancelling the July board meeting and Mr. Kros agreed to discuss with new Board Chair, Mr. Zimmerman and share decision with the Board.

Adjourn

Mr. Kros adjourned the meeting at 7:55pm. The next meeting of The Children's Guild DC Charter School (CGDCPCS) Board of Directors (BOD) is scheduled for July 10, 2017 at 6:00 pm.

As we move into preparing for the upcoming school, we have had the luxury of retaining the majority of our instructional staff. We are looking to add to the team with 2 elementary, 1 middle and 4 special education teachers with the anticipated increase of students.

Academics

This summer we are having teacher institutes and focus groups for our staff to come in and begin preparing for the upcoming school year. There will be Literacy, Project-Based learning, Whole Brain Teaching and others to ensure alignment and synergy with our instructional team in the new school year.

Current Enrollment

300 and rising

We have averaged 9 new and 10 re-enrolled students for the last three weeks. Of the 300 current enrollments for next year 197 of them are special education students.

Parent Involvement

We have two Parent Ambassadors whom are helping to promote the school in their communities by handing out fliers and recommending our school as a great option for their children.

It's Academic

The ESY program's theme is Healthy Eating and Nutrition. The instructional program will be presented to the students in a project based fashion, which will allow students to be actively involved in the questioning, data collection and final product that will be showcased at the culminating event as a demonstration of learning.

Summer Programming ESY

A select group of our special needs population has returned for our Extended School Year (ESY) program. This program is provided as a service through each students IEP. So they continue to work on their individual goals from their current IEP and community based projects guided by the instructional team. The program runs for the entire month of July in hopes that it will reduce the amount of regression in their programs.
